Dr. Les Joynes is a multimedia artist and research scholar on the models for the future of art education at Columbia University. He is professor of record for courses on Modern and Contemporary Art and Experimental Practices at Renmin University, Beijing and brings with him thirty-five years experience working with international organizations. Recipient of the Fulbright Professional and Academic Excellence Award, he was 2022 Fulbright-Nehru Senior Fellow at the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts and Visiting Associate Professor of Art and Art History at Visva Bharati University in West Bengal.

His work has been exhibited at the Art Gallery of New South Wales, Brazilian Museum of Sculpture, Museum of Brazilian Art, Norimatsu Museum, Japan, Beijing Inside Out Museum, and at the Barbican and Milch Gallery in London. His work is represented by Thomas Jaeckel Gallery in New York.

His writing and artwork have featured in Art in America, Springer, Journal for Artistic Research, Art Monthly London and lectures on artistic research at College Arts Association Conferences, Columbia University, Cambridge University, University of the Arts London, University of California Santa Barbara, University of Coventry, Kookmin University, Seoul and as visiting professor on the Institute for Cultural Industries at Peking University.

Joynes graduated with an MA Fine Art from Goldsmiths, London; PhD in Fine Art from the Faculty of Art, Environment and Technology, Leeds Metropolitan University, UK and Post-Doctorate in Fine Art, School of Communications and Arts, University of São Paulo, Brazil. He has an MA specialized in Asian Art from Musashino Art University, Tokyo; M.Sc from Boston University and the Vrije Universiteit Brussels Faculty of Economic and Social Sciences and was TrAIN Fellow at the University of the Arts London Research Center on Transnational Art, Identity and Nation. In 2018, Les initiated CAA's Artistic Research Group to explore future models for research in art education.

Since 2009, Les examines the futures of education and the arts at Columbia University and currently advises Sir JJ School of Art in Mumbai on their university curriculum design. As a Fulbrighter he recently leads faculty curriculum design workshops at the Gandhi Institute of Technology and Management (GITAM) in India.
